This book traces the impact of exile in the formation of independent republics in Chile and the Río de la Plata in the decades after independence. Exile was central to state and nation formation, playing a role in the emergence of territorial borders and Romantic notions of national difference, while creating a transnational political culture that spanned the new independent nations. Analyzing the mobility of a large cohort of largely elite political émigrés from Chile and the Río de la Plata across much of South America before 1862, Edward Blumenthal reinterprets the political thought of well-known figures in a transnational context of exile. As Blumenthal shows, exile was part of a reflexive process in which elites imagined the nation from abroad while gaining experience building the same state and civil society institutions they considered integral to their republican nation-building projects.

Victors' Justice Farrar, Straus and Giroux

This book addresses contemporary discourses on a wide variety of topics related to the ideological and epistemological changes of the 19th, 20th and 21st centuries, and the ways in which they have shaped the Spanish language and cultural manifestations in both Spain and Hispanic America. The majority of the chapters are concerned with 'otherness' in its various dimensions; the alien Other - foreign, immigrant, ethnically different, disempowered, female or minor - as well as the Other of different sexual orientation and/or ideology. Following Octavio Paz, otherness is expressed as the attempt to find the lost object of desire, the frustrating endeavour of the androgynous Plato wishing to embrace the other half of Zeus, who in his wrath, tore off from him. Otherness compels human beings to search for the complement from which they were severed. Thus a male joins a female, his other half, the only half that not only fills him but which allows him to return to the unity and reconciliation which is restored in its own perfection, formerly altered by divine will. As a result of this transformation, one can annul the distance that keeps us away from that which, not being our own, turns into a source of anguish. The clashing diversity of all things requires the human predisposition to accept that which is different. Such a predisposition is an expression of epistemological, ethical and political aperture. The disposition to co-exist with the different is imagined in the de-anthropocentricization of the bonds with all living realms. And otherness is, in some way, the reflection of sameness (mismidad). The other is closely related to

the self, because the vision of the other implies a reflection about the self; it implies, consciously or not, a relationship with the self. These topics are addressed in this book from an interdisciplinary perspective, encompassing arts, humanities and social sciences.

Por otra parte, la concreción y materialización de las apuestas de protección del ambiente suscritas por el Estado colombiano, que constituyen compromisos exigibles por todos los habitantes del planeta, conlleva desafíos en todas las etapas del ciclo de las operaciones, por lo que, en los escritos que componen el volumen, no solo explora la razón de ser de los deberes que tiene el Estado, relativos a la protección del medioambiente, sino que, de forma quizá mayormente inédita, se ocupa de las acciones concretas de protección que deben desplegar las Fuerzas Militares y hacer propuestas de uso específico de las funciones de conducción de la guerra en esta tarea. Igualmente, se aborda la pertinencia del principio de precaución para contribuir a evitar los daños ambientales, bajo el reconocimiento de la potencialidad dañina del accionar militar y, en consecuencia, del deber superior de reflexión, en cabeza de la Fuerza, al momento de preparación, planeación, ejecución y evaluación de las operaciones militares.
