policy at the national level is expected to

be commensurate with the challenges of the globalising society, it is observed that the STI potential of the developing countries often remains unexplored or underutilized due to lack of appropriate framework of formulation of the STI policy as well as inadequacies in its

implementation mechanisms. While formulating, the national policy should take into account the availability of natural resources and human resource within the country; a planned long term forecast of the growth of various factors to achieve progressive economic prosperity till the planned period and beyond; projected import and export of raw materials; import of technology with its adaption to meet the local requirements; etc. Keeping the above in view, the Centre for Science & Technology of the Non-Aligned and Other Developing Countries (NAM S&T Centre) and the Technology Studies Institute (TSI) of the Presidency of the Islamic Republic of Iran organised an international workshop on 'Science, Technology and Innovation (STI) Policy

Making for Developing Countries' during 28th November - 1st December 2014 at Kish Island, Iran. The above scientific event, which was attended by 26 experts, professionals, researchers and administrators from 13 countries, including Botswana, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Mauritius, Myanmar, Palestine, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Zambia, Zimbabwe and the host country Iran, facilitated the capacity building and exchange of information and expertise. The present book edited by Dr. Adnan Jawdat Judeh Yousef of Palestine, Dr. Budzanani Tacheba of Botswana and Ms. Maryam Shaeri of Iran is a follow up of the STI Policy Making workshop and comprises 22 scientific and technical papers contributed by eminent experts from 15 countries. The book has four

sections, namely, STI Policy Developments; Institutional Setting and Processes; STI and Competitiveness; and Capacitating STI. The book is expected to be of great value for the researchers, professionals, experts, non-governmental and governmental organisations who are working on various facets of STI Policy formulation and implementation in the developing countries. The Centre for Science and Technology of the Non-Aligned and Other Developing Countries (NAM S&T Centre) is an inter-governmental organisation with a membership of 48 countries spread over Asia, Africa, Middle East and Latin America. Besides this, 12 S&T agencies and academic/research institutions of Bolivia, Botswana, Brazil, India, Nigeria and

Turkey are the members of the S&T-Industry Network of the Centre. The Centre was set up in 1989 to promote South-South cooperation through mutually beneficial partnerships among scientists and technologists and scientific organisations in developing countries. It implements a variety of programmes including international workshops, meetings, roundtables, training courses and collaborative projects and brings out scientific publications, including a quarterly Newsletter. It is also implementing 7 Fellowship schemes, namely, NAM S&T Centre Research Fellowship, Joint NAM S&T Centre - ICCBS Karachi Fellowship, Joint CSIR/CFTRI (Diamond Jubilee) - NAM S&T Centre Fellowship, Joint NAM S&T Centre - ZMT Bremen Fellowship,

Research Training Fellowship for Developing Country Scientists (RTF-DCS), NAM S&T Centre - U2ACN2 Research Associateship in Nanosciences and Nanotechnology and Joint NAM S&T Centre - DST (South Africa) Training Fellowship on Minerals Processing and Beneficiation in Indian institutions. These activities provide, among others, the opportunity for scientist-to-scientist contact and interaction, training and expert assistance, familiarising the scientific community on the latest developments and techniques in the subject areas, and identification of technologies for transfer between member countries. The Centre has so far brought out 68 publications and has organised 97 international workshops.

The most generic challenge faced by many international courts is the level of obedience by their member states. The EACJ is not an island to this common reflection. Essentially, international courts are influential only when their decisions are easily complied with and executed by member states. If not, as with the case of the EACJ, then, such an international court will always be on the brink of being toothless and ineffective. At the end of each reference, the EACJ delivers a judgment. It also issues interim orders carrying a status

similar to that of a court judgment. Member States as well as the Council are bound to implement EACJ judgments without delay. But there are no established mechanisms to ensure compliance in the event that a state refuses to implement a decision against it. Since 2005 the EACJ has dealt with more than 190 matters. What is intriguing in those judgments is tracking the extent to which they have been met with compliance. Member States have not been sanctioned when they have failed to comply with the EACJ's decisions. It is a matter of fact and a matter of principle that the nature of EACJ judgments is declaratory, and this tends to attract noncompliance. The best the Court can offer is to declare violations of the law, give orders for

injunctive relief, and award costs to the successful applicants. The costs order depends on the nature of the case. Public interest cases do not attract costs orders.

William Paterson Jelley was born 6th July 1935 in Durban (South Africa) and died Ohope (New Zealand) 15th January 2009, aged 73 1/2 years. His passing was sudden and unexpected. However, his legacy lives on in his two grandchildren, Courtney Sacha and Brendan Vaughan Jelley. Bill was christened with his parent's names - Cecil William Gordon Jelley, born Qumbo, Transkei 11th October 1898 (and died 23rd June 1977) and his mother Mary McRobert Paterson, born Isipingo 1905 (and died 13th November 1943 - aged 38). His father then married spinster Joyce Pamela Deeves. Bill had an elder brother, Brian, born on 11th March 1932, who outlived

his younger brother. Brian passed away in Harare, Zimbabwe on 23 March 2014. Early childhood was spent in the Transkei where his father managed a Trading Store at Glenhope. The family then moved to Orange Grove, Johannesburg, where Cecil Jelley, known as Gordon or "Poppa Jel", secured employment with African Explosives. In 1937, the firm transferred the family from Johannesburg to Salisbury, Rhodesia. Bill started his schooling at the Convent School, and then went on to do his Standard 1 to Standard 4 at David Livingstone. Because the school did not have a standard 5, he then completed his junior schooling at Blakiston - named after a hero of the Mazoe Patrol. High Schooling, at Prince Edward, was completed to Form 3 General School

Certificate level in 1951. Bill joined the Royal Rhodesian Air Force as a Short Service Unit pilot (No 6 SSU), in March 1954, and commenced flying training at Cranbourne airfield, Salisbury on Tiger Moth aircraft. Bill Jelley commanded No's 2 and 4 Squadron, Royal Rhodesian Air Force, Thornhill, Gwelo. He commanded Flying Wing New Sarum, Salisbury, where No's 3, 5, 7 and 8 Squadrons were based. He ferried Provost aircraft from the United Kingdom to Rhodesia, attended Staff Course in South Africa and was decorated by the President of Rhodesia for Meritorious service to the Air Force. Bill served the Air Force, and his country, with distinction. Upon retiring he flew a variety of aircraft commercially in the corporate sector. He was an Officer and Gentleman in the true sense of the

word - right up to the day of his passing. Marjel moved to the Ohope care centre and some years later to the Kerikeri Old Age Home, where she passed away on her 84th birthday, 16 December 2019. Jean Jelley (her daughter-in-law) was at her bedside when Marjel passed away.
