Darling of the Jazz Age, the globe-trotting diplomat and acclaimed writer Paul Morand and his literary and political careers underwent a radical shift following his collaboration with the Vichy government during the Occupation of France. Abandoning the terse, glittering portraits of the contemporary era that had garnered him early fame, he turned to the past and to historical fiction, biography and autobiography. Paul Morand: The Politics and Practice of Writing in Post-War France, the first full-length study of Morand in English and the first ever of his post-war works, traces Morand's politically charged explorations of history as he obsessively rewrites the Occupation in historical guise. From Napoleonic Spain to the court of Louis XIV, nineteenth-century California, Revolutionary France and Venice across the ages, Morand probes the limits of historiography and genre as he constructs a curiously Benjaminian model of redemption for his collaborationist heroes. This book analyses Morand's post-war project, placing it within the highly-politicized context of writing during the de Gaullian era. Many issues are at stake in Morand's late oeuvre, from the genres of historical fiction, biography and autobiography, to the very act of historicization itself in the context of the post-war era. Morand's handling of these issues suggests that literature furnishes perhaps the best space within which the complex and highly political question of our ties to the past may be most tellingly examined.

This book is a study of the measurement and understanding of time in seventeenth-century Europe, particularly in France. Close readings of literary representations of time in Moliere, Mme de Sevigne, and Mmd de Lafayette are contextualized with historical studies of court life under Louis XIV, the restructuring of the early modern French postal system, and the emergence of new practices of periodical publication, respectively. An epistemological backdrop for these historical and literary studies is provided by an introductory analysis of developments in the science of time measurement under Louis XIV. A concluding section places questions of human temporality in the contemporary context of global environmental concerns.

Examining literary discourses on female friendship and intimacy in seventeenth-century France, this study takes as its premise the view that, unlike men, women have been denied for centuries the possibility of same sex friendship. The author explores the effect of this homosocial and homoprivileged heritage on the deployment and constructions of female friendship and homoerotic relationships as thematic narratives in works by male and female writers in seventeenth-century France. The book consists of three parts: the first surveys the history of male thinkers' denial of female friendship, concluding with a synopsis of the cultural representations of female same-sex practices. The second analyzes female intimacy and homoeroticism as imagined, appropriated and finally repudiated by Honoré d'Urfé's pastoral novel, L'Astrée, and Isaac de Benserade's seemingly lesbian-friendly comedy, Iphis et lante. The third turns to unprecedented depictions of female intimate and homoerotic bonds in Madeleine de Scudéry's novel Mathilde and Charlotte-Rose de Caumont de La Force's fairy tale Plus Belle que Fée. This study reveals a female literary genealogy of intimacies between women in seventeenth-century France, and adds to the research in lesbian and queer studies, fields in which pre-eighteenth-century French

literary texts are rare.

Die vorliegende Bibliographie möchte allen an der französischen Literatur Interessierten einen schnellen Zugriff auf Sekundärliteratur zu französischsprachigen Autorinnen und Autoren bieten. Da der Verfasser 26 Jahre in der Referendarausbildung tätig war, wird es nicht verwundern, wenn ein Schwerpunkt auf Schulautoren wie z. B. Maupassant, Mérimée, Camus, Sartre, Ionesco u.v.a. liegt. Um eine sinnvolle didaktische Analyse zu erstellen, war in der Regel eine eingehende Sachanalyse eben unter Berücksichtigung der entsprechenden Sekundärliteratur Voraussetzung. In den letzten Jahren weitete sich das Spektrum wesentlich aus, so dass Autorinnen und Autoren, bekannte und weniger bekannte, aus allen Epochen der Neuzeit und aus der gesamten Frankophonie berücksichtigt wurden. Um einen ersten, zeitsparenden Zugang zu einzelnen Monographien zu ermöglichen, wird sehr häufig auf Rezensionen hingewiesen. Insgesamt dürfte diese Bibliographie ein sehr nützliches Hilfsmittel für die Literaturrecherche sein, und zwar nicht nur für Französischlehrerinnen und -lehrer, sondern auch für alle, die sich mit französischsprachiger Literatur beschäftigen.

Conversation, which began as a way of passing time, eventually became the central ritual of social life.
