Classroom Questions is a book for English teachers who are teaching *Good Night, Mr. Tom* by Michelle Magorian and intend to set questions for homework or classwork. *Good Night, Mr. Tom Classroom Questions* contains 187 questions, divided by chapter, to keep students engaged and actively thinking about the novel. Why choose to study *Good Night, Mr. Tom* by Michelle Magorian? Themes of war, abuse and the power of friendship. The setting of wartime Britain. The developing friendship of Willie and Mr. Tom. Interesting characters - gruff Mr. Tom and sickly Willie Beech. Exciting storyline. Scene by Scene guides are teaching resources. They are short books of

An Interview with Michelle Magorian
